


NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER

- » Who are we? A unit within the NCAA.
- » What do we provide? Certification of college-bound student-athletes for collegiate competition.
- » What do we review?
 - Student transcripts.
 - Student athletics participation.
- » Why do we review? To create fair and equitable competition across NCAA schools and divisions.



COLLEGE ADMISSION

- » Apply and be accepted to the NCAA school before they can compete.
 - NCAA certification does **NOT** include acceptance to the NCAA school.
- » Ask college admission about:
 - Cost of attendance.
 - > Financial aid and scholarships.
 - > FAFSA.
 - Standardized test scores.
 - > May be required for college admission or scholarships.
 - > **NOT** required for NCAA certification.

ACADEMIC AND ATHLETICS CERTIFICATION ACCOUNT

Account Type #1



Required to compete at a Division I or II school:

- » Go on Division I official visits.
- » Sign for athletics aid.
- » Receive an athletics scholarship.



Registration fee:

- » Domestic students: \$110.
- » International students: \$170.
- » Check to see if they meet fee waiver criteria.



ATHLETICS CERTIFICATION ACCOUNT

Account Type #2



Recommended for all <u>international student-athletes</u> planning to compete at a Division III school.



Registration fee:

- » \$75.
- » Check to see if they meet fee waiver criteria.



Student-athletes transferring from a two-year school to an NCAA Division I or II school who did not require an Eligibility Center academic certification.



PROFILE PAGE ACCOUNT

Account Type #3



The right place to start for most students!

- » Not sure in which division they plan to compete.
- » <u>U.S. students</u> planning to compete at a <u>Division III school</u>.
- » Registering in an NCAA-certified nonscholastic basketball event.





» Not required for students with solely <u>international</u> academic credentials.



May receive athletics aid and practice but may NOT compete during their first year of

full-time enrollment.

DIVISION III

- » While Division III schools set their own academic standards on campus, the Eligibility Center certifies the amateurism status of Division III international studentathletes.
 - All other Division III student-athletes are certified on campus.
- » International student-athletes enrolling at a Division III school must register with an Athletics Certification account and receive their final amateurism certification before they can compete.
- » Effective Fall 2026, domestic studentathletes enrolling at a Division III school will need to register with a Profile Page account.







HIGH SCHOOL PORTAL

For Primary and Secondary Contacts



ACCOUNT ACCESS FOR NEW CONTACTS



» If the current primary and secondary contacts are no longer employed at your school, complete the High School Contact Change Form.

Note: Your school's primary and secondary contacts should have access to curriculum and student records and the bandwidth to have ongoing engagement with the Eligibility Center.

» Manage your school's core-course list, submit fee waivers, review open tasks and view student reports in the <u>High</u> School Portal.



MULTIFACTOR AUTHENTICATION (MFA) FOR HIGH SCHOOLS

- » The NCAA Eligibility Center has implemented multifactor authentication (MFA)
- » To view transcripts and student account information. MFA will be required once in a 24-hour period. This level of access is available only to individuals listed as the primary or secondary contact in the high school account.

ENHANCED VIEW FOR PRIMARY/SECONDARY CONTACTS

- 1. View student tasks
- 2. View academic evaluation (including deficiencies)
- 3. View the type of account the student-athlete has
- 4. Confirm when transcript received
 - *And see if other high school transcripts are missing

DISTRICT/SCHOOL BEST PRACTICES

- 1. Awareness by counselors of which students are student-athletes and preparing them to be academically eligible for NCAA/NAIA etc.
- 2. Keep district and school NCAA contacts up to date.
- 3. Keep District/School information and core courses updates.
- 4. USE the NCAA's FREE training! We are here to help!
 - a. Utilize professional development days if possible.
 - b. Incorporate NCAA registration into your athlete orientation process freshman year / 8th grade!

ATHLETICS AID (NEW SIGNING MODEL)

- » By signing for athletics aid, a student agrees to attend that Division I or II school.
- » Athletics aid is:
 - Voluntary and ends the recruiting process.
 - Provided for a minimum of one academic year.
 - > Student must be admitted to the NCAA school.
 - > Student must be eligible for financial aid under NCAA rules.

Who is covered by the core guarantees?

- -Student-athletes at Division I schools, plus studentathletes at a Division II or III school participating in a Division I sport.
- -Requires schools to provide student-athletes **academic services** and **career counseling**.

Schools also must provide **life skills training** and **education** in at least nine specified areas:

- Mental health.
- Diversity, equity, inclusion and belonging.*
- Sexual violence prevention.
- Transfer requirements.
- Strength and conditioning.
- o Nutrition.
- Financial literacy.
- Career preparation.
- Name, image and likeness opportunities.
