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




IT'S BIGGER THAN THE SCOREBOARD

 - leaders model respect, enthusiasm and set peer -driven standards
 - Expectations created translate into the hallways
- Stronger Relationships Across Grade Levels and Groups
 - o unified section blends non -athletes, all classes, clubs, and fans
 - o Builds a more inclusive campus culture
- Increased Daily Energy and Engagement
 - student leaders bring energy and excitement
 - students come more engaged
 - teachers feel supported
 - vibe becomes more positive and energized









THE LEGACY OF LEADERSHIP

Men in Black, Golden Girls, and Blues Brothers represent tradition, unity, and leadership with purpose


- Visibility equals responsibility

- Intentional work begins before the games











- Not just in the stands, but in classrooms, activities, and everyday interactions.


- Students rise to higher expectations when they feel connected, valued, and inspired






Life of an Owl Executive Council

- Coaches share expectations with parents and players








POSITIVE AND NEGATIVE >>>>> BEHAVIOR

- Positive word choices




- Yelling at officials



- Pep Band





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




